THE FIRST READING

Genesis 21:8-21

A Reading from the book of Genesis.

The child grew, and was weaned; and Abraham made a great feast on the day that Isaac was weaned. But Sarah saw the son of Hagar the Egyptian, whom she had borne to Abraham, playing with her son Isaac. So she said to Abraham, 'Cast out this slave woman with her son; for the son of this slave woman shall not inherit along with my son Isaac.' The matter was very distressing to Abraham on account of his son. But God said to Abraham, 'Do not be distressed because of the boy and because of your slave woman; whatever Sarah says to you, do as she tells you, for it is through Isaac that offspring shall be named after you. As for the son of the slave woman, I will make a nation of him also, because he is your offspring.' So Abraham rose early in the morning, and took bread and a skin of water, and gave it to Hagar, putting it on her shoulder, along with the child, and sent her away. And she departed, and wandered about in the wilderness of Beer-sheba.

When the water in the skin was gone, she cast the child under one of the bushes. Then she went and sat down opposite him a good way off, about the distance of a bowshot; for she said, 'Do not let me look on the death of the child.' And as she sat opposite him, she lifted up her voice and wept. And God heard the voice of the boy; and the angel of God called to Hagar from heaven, and said to her, 'What troubles you, Hagar? Do not be afraid; for God has heard the voice of the boy where he is. Come, lift up the boy and hold him fast with your hand, for I will make a great nation of him.' Then God opened her eyes, and she saw a well of water. She went, and filled the skin with water, and gave the boy a drink.

God was with the boy, and he grew up; he lived in the wilderness, and became an expert with the bow. He lived in the wilderness of Paran; and his mother got a wife for him from the land of Egypt. The Word of the Lord.

THE SECOND READING

Romans 6:1b-11

A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Church in Rome.

What then are we to say? Should we continue in sin in order that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin go on living in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it. The Gospel of the Lord.



THANK YOU! BISHOP STOKES FOR JOINING US TODAY! The Right Reverend William H. (Chip) Stokes is the twelfth Bishop of the Diocese of New Jersey. Elected on May 4, 2013, he was Consecrated on November 2, 2013 and succeeded The Right Reverend George Cancell. Prior to becoming the Bishop of New Jersey, he served as the Rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Delray Beach, Florida, a position he held from January 1999 through July of 2013. From 1995 to 1998, he was the Associate for Christian Education at the Episcopal Church of Bethesda-by-the-Sea in Palm Beach, Florida. Prior to this, he served as the School Chaplain and Curate to Grace Episcopal Church and Day School in Massapequa, Long Island, serving there from 1990 to 1994. Bishop Stokes earned a Master of Divinity Degree from the General Theological Seminary in New York in 1990 and a Bachelor of Arts from Manhattan College in 1987; he was recently awarded an honorary Doctorate of Divinity from the General Theological Seminary. He is a recognized preacher and Christian educator. He has been active in the area of anti-racism, is a certified trainer in multi-culturalism and anti-racism and was a member of the Committee on Anti-Racism for the Episcopal Church. He has served at many levels of governance in the Episcopal Church. While in Florida, he served as Chairman of the Board of Episcopal Charities of Southeast Florida. He was an active leader in his community in Delray Beach serving on several Boards and Committees and working actively to see that St. Paul's was actively engaged in the life of the city. He currently serves on the Board of Trustees of General Theological Seminary. He and his wife Susan have been married for 38 years and live in Trenton. THE 2020 YOUTH CONFIRMATION PROJECT PRESENTATION As many of you know, the 2020 Confirmation and Visitation of our Bishop was originally scheduled for Sunday, April 26 (new date TBD). In order to receive this Holy Sacrament, our registered Youth were requested to attend Confirmation prep classes since September 2019 and complete certain projects and activities. Their final projects are included in this email to share with you, just as would have been done in our Church building on Confirmation Sunday. Here is a closing letter to the Parish from Confirmation Class Teacher, Dale Chant:

Christ Church Confirmation Classes

Preparing our youth for confirmation is a challenging and important work of the church. I am very grateful for the leadership of the Church School Directors (Shanon Chant and Diane Zaraza), our clergy (Mother Petrina, Deacon Ted and Deacon Jose), our teachers (John Boland, Selena Garcia, Phyllis Long) and the parents of the students who created the space to make confirmation a priority in their children's lives.

We had 2 class times. One group met at 9:30 am and one at 12 noon. With the leadership of John Boland at the morning class and Selena Garcia and myself at the later class, the students learned about the Episcopal Church, their faith and explored what being confirmed means. We met 3 Sundays/ month and on the 4th Sunday the students participated as acolytes, ushers or lector's in the Church services. Our groups joined together for several activities throughout the year:

-The Diocesan Lock In. A shared Eucharist in the Cathedral followed by an outreach program where they prepared nutritional food packets that would be distributed to areas of need throughout the world.

-The Martin Luther King Day service at the 2nd Baptist Church where 2 of our students addressed the congregation telling of ways that they were serving their communities. After the service we joined together for lunch and shared stories and experiences of racism in their personal lives.

-The Christmas Pageant was an opportunity for them to share their many talents as some were narrators, actors and musicians.

-They came together to help decorate and run the All Parish Birthday Party.

-Retreat in an Envelope: this replaced a full day retreat that we had planned before the Covid19 shutdown. The people who were scheduled to present at the retreat provided thoughtful and inspiring written materials, activities, and even a YouTube guided meditation as an alternative to the day we had hoped for.

All students were required to complete a confirmation project.

They participated in an outreach program by volunteering a set number of hours and then sharing what they learned from their experience.

They all worked very hard to complete their projects and I am so proud of each and every one of them. Please take the time to look at each one (emailed to you on June 17). The afternoon class did a group outreach project addressing one of our Marks of Mission: Caring for the Earth. They put together new recycling bins to be placed throughout our church buildings with educational materials and posters. Unfortunately, we were not able to complete our last steps before the building was closed but we will.

Thank you to all who participated in the success of this year. Looking back on our time together I see that many seeds were planted in rich and fertile soil. God will surely continue the good work that has been started and these young people will walk with the love and support of Jesus and their Church as their faith journeys continue.

RE-OPENING CHRIST CHURCH BUILDING: Please know that your Wardens, Vestry, Clergy and Staff are prayerfully working together to discuss and address the requirements provided to us by the RRR Task Force in order to safely Re-Open our Church doors. There are many important steps to accomplish, one being a Questionnaire Survey for the Parish to complete. Your completion of this Survey will be added guidance as we discuss when it is most safe and appropriate to Re-Open our building. Please know that virtual / "stay at home" options to attend services will remain in place even after the building reopens and future in-person services resume.

THE COVID-19 REENTERING, REOPENING, REIMAGINING (RRR) TASK FORCE presented its preliminary report on June 4 to Clergy and Staff of the Diocese of New Jersey.

The Rev. Canon Valerie Balling, St. Peter's Medford, is chair of the Task Force. She told the meetings that the Task Force developed a report and recommendations for congregations to reenter their church buildings and reopen them for public worship and gatherings.

Congregations are urged to use this document to develop THEIR PLAN for reentering and reopening for their context, which may require some reimaging in order to offer their ministry as desired.

A questionnaire must be submitted to the Diocese and approved by the RRR Task Force and the Bishop's Office before a congregation can reopen to the public.

Reopening will be done in stages, with continued physical distancing requirements and cleaning and sanitation requirements to ensure safety. The Bishop will say what "Stage" the Diocese is in. No congregation may be in a later Stage; some congregations may be in an earlier Stage depending on local context. *(from NJ Diocesan Good News in the Garden State dated 6/5)*

A second group--the Learnings and Breakthroughs Task Force--has been formed to look at the lessons we've learned during this crisis and how we can keep the good parts happening. We've been amazed at the level of community we've been able to build online, bringing Christ's word to people who haven't been in church in years. We don't want to lose those aspects when we return to "normal."

COVID-19 DISCRETIONARY FUND: While everyone's life has been impacted by the coronavirus, we have become aware of several people in our parish who have already lost their jobs and income and are in dire need of emergency assistance. Also, as this disaster continues, we expect that more jobs will be affected. For this reason we are setting up a Coronavirus Discretionary Fund. This fund will provide emergency assistance to people affected by this disaster.
