Romans 8:12-25

A Reading from Paul's Letter to the Church in Rome.

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh—for if you live according to the flesh, you will die; but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God. For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received a spirit of adoption. When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ—if, in fact, we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him. I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. We know that the whole

creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. The Word of the Lord.

THANK YOU! FR. DAVE FOR BEING TODAY'S PRIEST.

The Rev. Dr. David L. Snyder — Hi...here is what you need to know about me! I am an Episcopal priest, canonically resident in the Diocese of New Jersey. In June 2016, I celebrated the 30th anniversary of my ordination to the ministry of Word and Sacrament (I was ordained to the ministry of Word and Sacrament in the *Lutheran Church in America* in June of 1986). I retired as Rector of *St. Andrew's* Episcopal Church in Mt. Holly, NJ on Sunday, January 27th, 2019. Prior to my call to St. Andrew's, I served as Interim Rector at *The Church of the Good Shepherd* in Pitman, New Jersey from November of 2014 to November of 2015. I am the "*husband of one wife*" (Susan) and we celebrated our 45th anniversary in August of 2018. I am the father of four children (Joshua; Rebecca; Timothy and Zachary) and



the grandfather of eight (five boys and three girls). Susan and I have lived in Burlington, NJ since July of 2005. I am a graduate of Lock Haven University (Lock Haven, Pennsylvania) with a BSc. in Education (May of 1972). I received the Master of Divinity degree from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, KY. (December of 1985), and the Doctor of Ministry degree from the Bangor Theological Seminary (Bangor, Maine) in May of 1997. Since graduating from seminary, I have served as Associate Pastor of Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Pottstown, PA. (1985-1989); Pastor of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in Newington, NH (1989-1997); Pastor of the Lutheran Church of the Nativity in North Conway, NH (1997-1998). I began my formal association with the Episcopal Church in August of 2000 when I was called to serve as the part time Rector of St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Bridgton, Maine (2000-2005). At the time, I was the first pastor in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to be called to serve an Episcopal Church following "Called to Common Mission" which brought the Episcopal Church and the ELCA together in a "full communion" relationship. In February of 2008, I was officially welcomed into the Episcopal Church and the Diocese of New Jersey. I am currently serving as a member of Project Resource: The Diocesan Stewardship Commission for the Diocese of New Jersey. I am a Trustee of Doane Academy (an Episcopal day school in Burlington, NJ).

LAST DAY TO RESPOND IS SUNAY, JULY 19! THE COVID-19 CONGREGATIONAL SURVEY IS CLOSES ON JULY 19. The survey was emailed to all a third time on Wednesday, July 16. PLEASE, if you have not already done so, take a moment (less than 5 minutes) to respond to just 10 simple multiple choice questions. The responses to this survey by each parishioner and regular attendee of Christ Church services and ministry groups is vital to the decision making of the Wardens, Vestry, Clergy and Staff in re-opening the building for in person services and ministries.

Those that do not have an email address registered with Christ Church were mailed a hard copy of this survey on June 29. We ask you to please send it back to the Church at your earliest convenience. If you also would prefer a hard copy, please contact the Church Office. We thank you for your time in completing this short survey. Re-OPENING CHRIST CHURCH BUILDING: Please know that your Wardens, Vestry, Clergy and Staff are prayerfully working together to discuss and address the many requirements of the Reentering, Reopening, Reimagining (RRR) Diocesan Task Force in order to safely re-open our Church doors. There are many important steps to accomplish before considering a date to re-open our doors for public use. One first step is the completion of the COVID-19 Congregational Survey (mentioned above) by all parishioners and regular attendees by Sunday, July 19. Your collective completion of this Survey will be added guidance as we begin to discuss when it is most safe and appropriate to re-open our building. We appreciate your time in completing this short survey. Please know that virtual / "stay at home" options to listen to LIVE services will remain in place even after the building reopens and future in-person services resume.

<u>WEEKLY FINANCES</u>: During the year 2020, we have budgeted \$5,635 to come from pledges and loose offerings each week. For the week ending July 10, we received \$6,167 in pledges. (There were no loose offerings due to there not being any services in church.)

COVID-19 DISCRETIONARY FUND: While everyone's life has been impacted by the coronavirus, we have become aware of several people in our parish who have already lost their jobs and income and are in dire need of emergency assistance. Also, as this disaster continues, we expect that more jobs will be affected. For this reason we are setting up a Coronavirus Discretionary Fund. This fund will provide emergency assistance to people affected by this disaster. If you are in need of emergency assistance, please contact one of the clergy (Mother Petrina, Deacon Jose, or Deacon Ted). If you are able to contribute to this fund, please send a check to Christ Church (415 Washington St. Toms River, NJ 08753) with "Coronavirus Fund" in the memo. A restricted account has been established specifically for this purpose. May God bless us all.
