RESUMING IN-PERSON SERVICES: Please know that your Wardens, Vestry, Clergy and Staff are prayerfully working together to discuss and address the many requirements of the Reentering, Reopening, Re-imagining (RRR) Diocesan Task Force in order to safely re-open our Church doors.

The first important step was to have all parishioners and regular attendees complete the COVID-19 Congregational Survey. Thank you for completing. The compiled results have been reviewed and have provided added guidance as we determine when and how it is most safe and appropriate to resume services in person. Please note that after discussion with our Clergy, we are now in the EARLY stages of planning to resume inperson services with services OUTDOORS hopefully on a Sunday in September.

We will keep you updated on this plan in the weeks to come, continually to approach with safety, consideration and love for all as a priority.

Please know that virtual/ "stay at home" options will remain available.

WEEKLY FINANCES: During the year 2020, we have budgeted \$5,635 to come from pledges and loose offerings each week. For the week ending July 24, we received \$2,395.34 in pledges. (There were no loose offerings due to there not being any services in church.)

THE FOOD PANTRY is going strong and remains open to anyone in need every Tuesday from 9:30am - 12 noon. We are still accepting donations, but currently only in need the following specific items: Canned peaches, pears, mandarin oranges, and chicken and rice soup. If you would like to donate, please leave items on the table marked 'Donations' outside the lower door during Food Pantry open hours. COVID-19 DISCRETIONARY FUND: While everyone's life has been impacted by the coronavirus, we have become aware of several people in our parish who have already lost their jobs and income and are in dire need of emergency assistance. Also, as this disaster continues, we expect that more jobs will be affected. For this reason we are setting up a Coronavirus Discretionary Fund. This fund will provide emergency assistance to people affected by this disaster.
